Notes on People Nixon Servants Off U.S. Payroll

Nixon Set The valet and maid long in service to the family of Richard M. Nixon have not been on the Federal Govern-ment payroll since Oct. 5, it was announced yesterday. The couple, Manolo and Fina Sanchez, had been listed on the payroll of the National Park Service at annual sala-ries of \$13,000 and \$8,000 respectively. The Sanchezes, now listed "on leave without pay," are in that status be-cause of some Government benefits to which they are entitled. Last month it was disclosed that the two serv-ants were being paid with public funds even though they left the White House Aug. 9, which resulted in propriations subcommittee's consideration—and reduction —of a requested \$850,000 in transition funds for the for-mer President. The White House said the Sanchezes were remaining on Mr. Nixon's personal staff in san Clemente, Calif., and that heir 'salaries were being paid from the former Presi-dent's personal funds.
