

Ex-Chief of Hospital Convicted

Miami

The ousted head of Miami's modern but money-troubled Cedars of Lebanon Hospital was convicted late yesterday on 64 counts involving more than \$800,000 in missing hospital funds.

Sanford K. Bronstein, who was fired shortly after former President Nixon dedicated a new hospital wing, sat impassively as a circuit court clerk read the verdict of the six-woman jury.

Bronstein, 57, was found guilty on 64 counts involving \$862,750.

The former hospital head was released upon posting a cash bond of \$100,000.

The convictions were on 63 counts of grand larceny, forgery and conspiracy.
