NYTimes NOV 1 4 1974 Milk Aide Says Employers **Authorized Campaign Gifts**

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Nov. 13 (AP)—Dayid L. Parr of North Little Rock says that his employers at Associated Milk Producers, Inc., including the board of directors, authorized him to make the illegal campaign contributions that the association is trying to recover from him.

Mr. Parr, formerly second in command at the association, made the statement yesterday in a document filed at Little Rock in response to a suit filed by the association. He also said A.M.P.I. owed him \$2,374,000 damages for maligning him and illegally canceling his employment contract.

The suit was filed Oct. 7 in United States District Court to recover \$244,450 in corporate funds. Mr. Parr has pleaded guity to donating the money to political campaigns.

In July, the Watergate special prosecutor's office charged Mr. Parr with conspiring to donate illegally \$222,450 from A.M.P.I. corporate funds. He pleaded guilty and was sentenced to four months in prison and fined \$5,000.
