WXPost NOV 1 6 1974 Historian Hits Bid to Destroy Nixon Tapes

NEW YORK, Nov. 15 (AP)—Former President Nixon's taping of individuals without their knowledge was a "gross abuse of the oral history idea" but destruction of the tapes would be unpardonable, says Prof. Louis M. Starr, head of University's oral history collection.

Noting White House contentions that the Nixon tapes should be destroyed because they never should have been made, Starr cited former President Warren Harding's letters to his mistress.

"Those probably shouldn't have been written, but even Harding's heirs agree they should be preserved for history."
