At a Washington hotel, which officials declined to name, preparations were made today to serve the 12 jurors, five alternates, members of their families and 17 marshals traditional dinners of turkey, stuffing and cranberry sauce.

In all, plans were made to serve 76 persons in a single banquer room. There will be television sets for watching football.
