HICKMAN, WHO attended the former President during both of his stays at Long Beach Memorial Hospi-tal, issued a favorable state-ment on Nixon's condition af-ter an afternoon visit at his seaside estate. "I am pleased that Mr. Nixon is making satisfactory progress, although he clearly remains in a period of conva-lescence," Hickman said. "Mr. Nixon has not regain-ed his normal weight and tires easily. There are no in-dications of additional com-plications at this time." Hickman said Nixon left his attended the former President

Hickman said Nixon left his compound this morning for compound this morning for the first time since being re-leased from the hospital on Nov. 14, to undergo chest X-ray examinations at the near-by Marine Corps hospital clinic at Camp Pendleton. Hickman said the X-rays "indicate clearing of the left plural effusion in the area of right pneumontis," a compli-cation that developed after Nixon underwent surgery for his blood clots.
