WXPosDEC 9 1974 Nixon Testimony Wanted, Poll Says

By 68 to 25 per cent, a majority of the American people feels that former President Nixon "should be asked questions under oath at San Clemente, and his answers should be used as part of the Watergate trial," according to a Louis Harris Survey.

This majority has scarcely changed since late September, even though the former President has been critically ill in the interim and courtappointed doctors have declared him too ill to testify at the trial.

A cross-section of 1,525 adults was interviewed before the doctors appointed by Judge John J. Sirica determined that Nixon could not give depositions in San Clemente before Jan. 6 and could not testify in Washington until mid-February.
