## 'Sterlizing' Shots Panic Mexico City

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 11 (AP)-Rumors that persons disguised as inoculation teams were giving school children shots that sterilized them forced health authorities to suspend all vaccination drives today and to post police outside Mexico City schools.

Thousands of parents stormed various schools in the Mexico City area yesterday and took their children home.

Thousands more expected to keep their children home today despite Health Ministry promises that police would guard each school against unauthorized medical teams and despite assurances from the Mexican Medical Association that there is no such thing as a sterilization vaccine.
