NYTimes Election Unit **PleadsGuilty on Gift** From Steinbrenner

DEC 14 1974 WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP) A political committee that raised funds for the 1974 re-clection campaign of Senator Daniel K. Inouye, Democrat of Hawai, pleaded guilty today to failing to report \$5,650 in con-tributions from the American Ship Building Company. United States District Court Judge George L. Hart Jr. sus-pended sentence for what he said was a technical violation of campaign contribution laws. The money in question went to a committee known as "DKI for"74" and was returned after rumors that George M. Stein-brenner 3d, board chairman of American Ship building, was under investigation for illegal campaign contributions. Mr. Steinbrenner, who is also a general partner in the New DEC 14 1974

campaign contributions. Mr. Steinbrenner, who is also a general partner in the New York Yankees baseball teams, was fined \$15,000 by a Federal judge after pleading guilty ear-lier this year to make illegal campaign contributions to for-mer President Richard M. Nix-on and several members of Congress, including Senator In-ouye. ouve.

Congress, including Senator In-ouye. Bowie Kuhn, the Commis-sioner of Baseball, also sus-pended Mr. Steinbrenner from active participation in the man-agement of the Yankees for two years. According to Thomas Mc Bride, an Assistant Special Prosecutor, the money came to Mr. Inouye's campaign in sever-al checks during July and Au-gust of 1973. Papers filed in connection with the case indi-cate that the money was re-turned Sept. 24, 1973. The com-mittee violated the law by fail-ing to report the contribution to the Secretary of the Senae. Judge Hart said that while the money should have been re-turned immediately instead of it being deposited in the com-mittee's bank account the vio-lation, nonetheless, was inad-vertent.

watergate prosecutors said the money was contributed in connection with a fund-raising dinner for Mr. Inouye held Aug. 3, 1973. The treasurer for the dinner was listed as K. Harry Tokushige.

No other officers of Inouye's fund-raising organization were named.
