- A political committee that raised funds for the 1974 reelection Campaign of Senator Daniel K. Inouye, Democrat of Hawai, pleaded guilty today to failing to report $\$ 5,650$ in conributions from the American Ship Building Company.

Mr. Steinbrenner, who is also a general partner in the New York Yankees baseball teams, was fined $\$ 15,000$ by a Federal judge after pleading guilty earlier this year to make illegal campaign contributions to former President Richard M. Nixon and several members of Congress, including Senator In ouye.
Bowie Kuhn, the Commis ioner of Baseball, also sus pended Mr. Steinbrenner from active participation in the man agement of the Yankees fo two years.
According to Thomas Mc Bride, an Assistant Special rosecutor, the money came to Mr. Inouye's campaign in several. checks during July and Au gust of 1973. Papers filed in connection with the case indi ate that the money was re urned Sept 241973 . The com mittee violated the law by fail ing to report the contribution to the Secretary of the Senae: Judge Hart said that whil the money should have been returned immediately instead of it being deposited in the committee's bank account the vioation, nonetheless, was inadvertent

Watergate prosecutors said the money was contributed in connection with a fund-raising dinner for Mr. Inouye held Aug. 3, 1973. The treasurer for the dinner was listed as K. Harry Tokushige.
No other officers of Inouye's und-raising organization were named.
