

## Ehrlichman Dickers For Radio News Job

### Washington

Convicted Watergate conspirator John Ehrlichman is negotiating with the Mutual Broadcasting System for a job as a radio commentator on national domestic and economic affairs.

Ehrlichman was domestic affairs adviser to former President Nixon before resigning April 30, 1973, because of the Watergate scandal. Before joining the Nixon re-election campaign Ehrlichman had been a lawyer

in Seattle, where he now lives.

Mutual network president Edward Little says no agreement has been reached with Ehrlichman but that discussions will continue.

"Speaking personally," he said, "the Watergate cover-up conviction does not affect my opinion of Ehrlichman's ability, mind, creativity or what he can do for the United States and the Mutual Broadcasting System."
