
Humphrey Aide Enters Plea to Election Charge

Jack Chestnut pleaded innocent yesterday in U.S. District Court to a charge of arranging an illegal corporate contribution by Associated Milk Producers, Inc., to Democratic Senator Hubert H. Humphrey's 1970 campaign.

Chestnut, a 42-year-old Minneapolis attorney, managed Humphrey's 1970 Minnesota election campaign for the U.S. Senate.

In a one-count indictment, Chestnut was accused of arranging with officials of the milk producers to send two payments of \$6000 each to an advertising firm for services rendered in behalf of Humphrey.

If convicted, Chestnut could face up to two years in prison and a maximum fine of \$10,000.

No trial date was set.
