

Jaworski's Doubts on Rebozo Prosecution

Leon Jaworski, former Watergate special prosecutor, doubts that criminal cases can be made against C. G. Rebozo for his role in handling Nixon campaign contributions, the Miami Herald reported yesterday.

Jaworski said in the Herald interview that he did not think Rebozo, generally regarded as former President Nixon's best friend, would be prosecuted for his role in handling contributions including a \$100,000 donation from billionaire Howard Hughes.

Rebozo said he was "delighted that Jaworski came to the only conclusion any fair-minded person would come to based on the facts."

"You know that if they had found anything — and they must of checked every one of the charges — they would have hung me," Rebozo said.

Rebozo has said that he received the money in cash installments in 1968 and 1972. He said he kept it in a safe deposit box in his bank, and returned the money in 1973.
