

The Supreme Court yesterday rejected the request of G. Gordon Liddy to remain free on bail while he seeks highcourt review of his Watergate burglary conviction.

Liddy, former counsel to the Nixon re-election campaign committee, was released temporarily while the U.S. Court of Appeals reviewed his case but was ordered back to prison after the conviction was affirmed.

was affirmed. The court must decide later whether his case raises issues that are significantly serious to warrant full review. He is under sentence of six to 20 years in the burglary case and a concurrent term of one to three years in the Daniel Ellsberg psychiatrist break-in case.
