Dean Says He Heard That Nixon Was Confident on Tapes Issue

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15—Dean that unanimously rejected Dean W. ... said today the White House assertion that he had seen the former executive privilege entitled Mr. President Richard M. Nixon to refuse to make the ... tapes available to the Watergate special prosecutor.

Dean said he had heard in response to other questions ... Mr. Dean also said that he had heard from Mr. Colson that a Supreme Court spokesman at the Federal Bureau of Investigation had removed a listening device planted by the Central Intelligence Agency in the former White House compound.

Liddy to Start Term

DANBURY, Conn., Jan. 14 (AP)—One of the convicted Watergate burglars, G. Gordon Liddy, is scheduled to report to the Federal prison in Danbury shortly after this ... sentenced to a six-to-20-year term for his role in the 1972 break-in at Democratic headquarters at the Watergate complex in Washington, he had been free on bail pending an appeal.

The Supreme Court ruled yesterday, however, that he must return to prison while the high court considered his appeal.

A spokesman for the Bureau of Prisons in Washington said that Mr. Liddy would be committed to the Danbury prison upon his surrender.
