Magruder Says Prisoners  
Might Try to Kill Mitchell

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15 (UPI) — Former Attorney General John N. Mitchell's life might be in danger if he were sent to prison and other inmates were allowed access to him, Jeb Stuart Magruder said today.

Mr. Magruder, who was released from prison last Wednesday after serving seven months on Watergate conspiracy charges, said that some convicts might hold Mr. Mitchell personally responsible for their jail terms.

"I think there is no question that someone who had been Attorney General of the United States, as far as many convicts are concerned, he is the one that put them away," Mr. Magruder said.

**It Would Be Dangerous**

"So I think for someone of that stature to have to go to a regular prison where there are inmates, maybe someone like Arthur Bremer, who might feel very comfortable in becoming famous by eliminating the ex-Attorney General."

Mr. Bremer is serving time in a Maryland prison for shooting Governor George C. Wallace of Alabama in 1972.

Mr. Mitchell has been found guilty of taking part in the Watergate cover-up. Sentencing has been postponed, pending appeal.
