**Gurney Trial  
Told of Tactics  
Of Fund-Raiser**

TAMPA, Fla., March 31 (UPI)—A former Florida Republican official testified today he learned in 1971 that a fund-raiser for former Sen. Edward Gurney, on trial for bribery and conspiracy, was using "strong-arm" tactics to extract political contributions from builders.

But former State GOP Finance Committee Chairman George Anderson, being cross-examined by defense attorneys, said he did not tell the senator about the activities of fund-raiser Larry Williams.

Anderson continued to be cross-examined by defense lawyers today as the bribery-conspiracy trial of Gurney and four others entered its sixth week.

Under questioning from Gurney's attorney, C. Harris Dittmar, Anderson recalled a telephone conversation with former Democratic gubernatorial candidate Brailey Odham in which Odham told him Williams had tried to "strong-arm" him into buying a \$500 ticket to a Nixon dinner.
