Allen I. Green, an engineer who admitted paying kickbacks to former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew, was released yesterday after serving four months in prison for a federal tax violation.

Green, who said he made the payments in return for state and county contracts in Maryland, played an essential part in the federal investigation which led to Agnew's resignation as vice president, the U.S. attorney's office in Baltimore said. Agnew pleaded no contest to tax evasion, but was not sentenced to prison.

He was paroled after serving the minimum term of four months.
