

McCloskey Hires a Watergate Figure

Washington

Congressman Paul McCloskey announced yesterday he has hired Watergate figure Egil (Bud) Krogh as a legislative assistant.

Krogh masterminded the September 3-4, 1971 break-in at the office of Dr. Lewis Fielding, Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist.

Krogh, 35, a former assistant to John D. Ehrlichman, later pleaded guilty to one count of violating Fielding's civil rights, and served four months and 17 days at a fed-

eral prison farm in Allentown, Pa.

Krogh was licensed to practice law in Washington state, but the disciplinary board of the state bar requested he be disbarred.

The outcome is pending on a ruling by the Washington State Supreme Court.

McCloskey said he believes Krogh is "a superb lawyer, with tremendous abilities. I think he'll be the best legislative assistant on the Hill."

The congressman said Krogh will specialize in legislation concerning a nation-
