New Trial Asked in Carolina In Billy Graham Day Suit

In Billy Graham Day Suit CHARLOTTE, N. C., July 3 (UPI)—The attorney for 18 persons who contend their rights were violated when they were barred from attending a speech by former President Richard M. Nixon here in 1971 has asked for a new trial of the case. A United States District Court jury in May decided that the plaintiffs had no grounds for receiving damages from the defendants — former White House aides, the Charlotte Po-lice Department and members of the local Veterans of Foreign Wars who served as volunteer ushers during the "Billy Gra-ham Day" visit. The plaintiffs asked for \$1.1 million. George S. Daly Jr., who rep-resented the plaintiffs, con-trial that the verdict was "against the weight of the evi-dence and did not properly ap-ply the law to the facts."
