## Costs Plus Inflation

WASHINGTON, July 17 (AP) -The House passed today by a vote of 393 to 18 a \$7.5-billion measure to fund the Treasury, White House and other agencies and cutting requests for funds for former President Richard M. Nixon's staff by \$81,848.

Whilt Mr. Nixon's \$60,000-pension is not affected, the bill sent to the Senate would allow only \$121,152 for staff

allow only \$121,152 for staff expenses during the 15 months that began July 1. President Ford had requested \$203,000 for Mr. Nixon's staff. The Appropriations Commit-tee rtcommended the lower fi-gure, saying it was based on the current costs of the Nixon staff with a 5 per cent allow-ance for inflation. Overall, the bill comes close to budget recommendations. The committee said in its report

to budget recommendations. The committee said in its report that that the would have "minimal overall inflationary impact on prices and costs." The amounts requested for Pres Ford'sident White House residence and office were al-lowed in full in the bill, with

lowed in tuil in the bill, with only what the committee called a technical adjustment relating to allocation of certain rental charges. These include \$1.8-million for the residence; \$16.7-million for office salaries and expenses and \$978,000 for special assis-tance tance.

An amendment designed to tighten the requirement that persons assigned to the White House from other agencies be paid by the White House—or that the appropriation be re-duced accordingly—lost. The bill includes \$3.061-bil-lion for the Treasury Depart-ment; \$1.998-billion for inde-pendent agencies. All figures are for the fiscal year that began July plus a three-month transitional period during which the Government will shift to a fiscal year beginning which the Government will shift to a fiscal year beginning Oct. 1.
