Gurney Jury Deliberates  
A 2d Day Without Verdict

TAMPA, Fla., July 29 (AP)—  
Former Senator Edward J.  
Gurney, looking cheerful and  
relaxed, joked about eluding  
photographers today before the  
jury began its second day of  
deliberations in the influence  
peddling case against him.

A few minutes later, United  
States District Judge Ben  
Krentzman entered the court-  
room and accused reporters of  
harassing the jurors.

The criticism was apparent-  
ly prompted by newspaper  
accounts of how they adjourned  
yesterday without informing  
the judge and leaving \$56,000  
in cash, a government exhibit,  
in the jury room.

Judge Krentzman said he  
saw no reason for reporting the  
incident, but he also said he  
was ordering marshals to place  
the cash in a vault.

The jury met for seven hours  
before recessing for the day.  
The panel has deliberated 11  
hours over two days without  
reaching a verdict in the  
bribery and conspiracy case.
