

**Chapin to Report
To Prison Aug. 10**

Dwight Chapin, former President Nixon's personal appointments secretary, is scheduled to report to prison in Lompoc, Calif., on Aug. 10 to begin serving a prison sentence for his conviction on perjury charges, according to court records.

Chapin, who faces a minimum term of 10 months, was convicted by a federal jury here in April, 1974, on two counts of lying to a Watergate grand jury probing the activities of political saboteur Donald Segretti. Chapin's conviction was upheld two weeks ago by the U.S. Court of Appeals.

Chapin's attorney, Jacob Stein, said no final decision has been made on whether to appeal the conviction to the U.S. Supreme Court. He said Chapin wanted to begin serving the sentence pending any further possible appeal in order to conclude the matter.
