# Nixon Guilty, Warren Says

Washington

Chief Justice Warren, who was deputy press secretary to President Nixon, said yesterday he believes Mr. Nixon was guilty of obstruction of justice.

Asked if he thought Mr. Nixon committed any crime in connection with Watergate, Warren responded, "Yes, I do. I do indeed."

Warren, who remained at the White House under President Ford, was in government service for 20 years. He was director of the San Diego Union from September 1, 1954, to August 31, 1955. He was interviewed on the CBS program "Face the Nation."

He said the 1974 tapes released by Mr. Nixon in July 1974 clearly show "guilt."

Warren said, however, that he did not intend to bring Mr. Nixon himself to court. He said he was speaking of crime in the context of the impeachment inquiry which was then under way.
