

Notes on People

The time is ripe for expansion of cultural and scientific exchanges between the United States and China, Senator Jacob K. Javits said yesterday after he and his wife, Marian, returned Sunday [17 Aug] from two weeks in the People's Republic with three other Senators and three Representatives.* Senator Javits [co-chairman of the trip] said the main obstacle to exchanges had been continued American recognition of Taiwan. The New York Republican said that while he believed the United States should stand by its treaties with Taiwan as well as South Korea, he would discuss with the State Department "a diplomatic means of dealing with the issue."
