

Security at San Clemente

San Clemente

The Secret Service declined to comment about whether it tightened security at the home of former President Richard M. Nixon after a woman pointed a gun at his successor yesterday.*

"We have security in effect on a 24-hour basis. I'm not going to comment on tightening of securi-

ty," said Robert E. Powis, special agent in charge of the Secret Service's Los Angeles office.

Sergeant Frank Yerger of the San Clemente police said his department had been asked to increase patrols around Mr. Nixon's seaside home several times in the past but had no such request yesterday.
