CONGRESS UNITS ACT
TO OPEN NIXON FILES

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10
(UPI)—Two Congressional panels moved today to force nearly complete public disclosure of 42 million White House documents that former President Richard M. Nixon contends belong to him.

The action ultimately could make possible the first radio broadcast of Mr. Nixon's White House tape recordings.

Panels in the House and Senate rejected as inadequate a set of proposed rules governing release of the documents and of the tapes. The rules were drafted by Arthur F. Sampson, Administrator of the General Services Administration.

The Senate was expected to take up tomorrow a resolution approved unanimously by the Senate Government Operations Committee that formally disapproves Mr. Sampson's proposed rules.

The House Administration Subcommittee on Printing also approved a resolution rejecting some proposed regulations on access to the documents
