

Chapin Asks High Court

To Review Perjury Case

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15 (AP)

—Dwight L. Chapin, onetime appointments secretary to President Nixon, asked the Supreme Court Monday to review his perjury conviction.

Mr. Chapin is serving a term of from 10 to 30 months arising out of his grand jury testimony concerning so-called political "dirty tricks" during the 1972 Presidential campaign.

In his petition, Mr. Chapin argued that the questions he was asked before the grand jury were ambiguous.

He also questioned "whether any official in the Nixon Administration, and especially one who served on the White House staff, could obtain a fair trial on any charge brought in the District of Columbia during the height of the Watergate crisis in 1974."

Mr. Chapin unsuccessfully sought to have his trial held elsewhere.
