G. Gordon Liddy, the Watergate burglar, has complained that somebody is being underhanded about opening his mail at the Federal prison in Danbury, Conn. Mr. Liddy told a Federal judge in New Haven Tuesday that prison officials had opened 250 attorney-client or other "privileged" letters when the inmate-addressees were not present as required by the rules. The prison explanation: Such incidents are occasional accidents among the 3,000 pieces of mail daily that must be searched for contraband.
