He said he did the same work for two years in his native Cuba, but in Miami he was a real estate agent "until the market went bad." Mr. Barker, who is still on parole, said he had been living on the advance from a forthcoming book and the \$140-a-week earnings of his wife, Clara. Although his main duties will be to edu-cate the public in the disposal of garbage, he will have power to take violators to court.
