Report of Nixon Aid to Iraq Rebels

The CLA **Suchy delivered** millions of dollars worth of Soviet and Chinese arms and ammuni-tion that were turned over to Kurdish rebels in northeastern Iraq, according to sources:

The CIA, one source said, collected some of the munitions in Cambodia.

The House committee con-fronted Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, who was Mr. Nixon's national security adviser, with the information in executive session Friday afternoon, but Kissinger said he would eppose public disclosure. St scr

The reported episode was first disclosed Saturday hight on CBS News by correspondent Dan-iel Schorr. Sources confirmed to the Washington Post that the committee has uncovered such information and considers the operation flegal.

Iran's Shah Mohamed Reza Pahlevi reportedly asked Mr Nixon for a secret supply of arms for the Kardish rebels when Mr. Nixon visited Teberan in May, 1972.

The Shah had souled an alliance with the Kurds led by leneral Mulla Mustafa Barzani ust a month earlier when a riendship and cooperation treaty between haq and the Soviet Union convinced him he was being "encircled" and prompted im to try to keep the Iraql Army pinned down in Kurdistan, a nountainous region carved up by the modern-day borders of Iran, Iraq, the Soviet Union, Turkey and Syria.

Both the CIA and the State Department, then headed by Secretary William Regers, were understood to have opposed American involvement, but Mr. Nixon, reportedly confiding only in Kinsinger rather than the National Security Council, insist-

ed that the CIA supply the arms, according to sources. funneieu moaign. election campaign.

Watergate prosecutors inve-tigated the rumors, at one poin even interviewing Saudi Arabia financier Adnan Khashoggi abo allegations that he might ha been a conduit, but the prosetors were never able to establianything.

According to the information supplied to the House committee, sources said, the Soviet and Chinese arms were sent to Iran by the CIA. The Kurds renewed the war against Iraq in March-1974, at the expiration of a four-year true, but were abandance. year truce, but were abandoned a year later when the shah reached his own settlement with Iraq.

The rebellion was crushed shortly after the head of Iran s secret police, originally founded with CIA help, delivered the work to Barzani that the alliance was at an end.
