

**12 CONGRESSWOMEN
SEE SZECHWAN TOWN**

PEKING, Jan. 4 (Reuters) — Twelve American Congresswomen left Peking by air today to visit Chengtu in the southwestern province of Szechwan.

The mountain-locked region bordering Tibet has seldom been open to foreigners. The group had meetings during their stay here with Deputy Prime Minister Teng Hsiao-ping and Foreign Minister Chiao Kuan-hua.

Both leaders delivered messages on the dangers of Soviet-American détente.

Julie and David Eisenhower meanwhile went sightseeing in southern China as a special film of their visit was screened throughout the country. The rush production of a color documentary commemorating their tour came amid heavy coverage of the visit in the Chinese press.
