here. He gave a deposition in a wiretapping damage suit brought by Morton H, Halperin, a former National Security Council aide who is now an A.C.L.U. employe. Mr. Halperin is suing Mr. Nixon, Mr. Haldeman, Secre-tary of State Henry A. Kis-singer and other Government officials over a wiretap the former President has admitted ordering placed on his tele-phone.

prdering placed on his tele-phone. Mr. Haldeman told reporters he was "here to answer all questions." He said he was spending his spare time writing a book on his days in Wash-ington. He added that the un-completed work "would have some things you haven't heard yet" concerning the Watergate a candal.
