Richard Nixon is due back in Los Angeles in the next few minutes, concluding his controversial nine-day trip to China. Good evening. This is Steve Young, reporting on the CBS Radio Network.

Secret Service agents have been asked by the former President to keep the public away. Reporting from Los Angeles International Airport, KNX reporter, Boyd Harvey:

Harvey: [First portion of taped insert unintelligible, having been broadcast at wrong speed.] .... the barricades are up, the cameras are here, reporters are waiting, and all for a man named Richard Nixon, a man who used to be President. But Nixon no longer is President, just another citizen. There is no official welcoming party, there are no friends, there are no demonstrators. Tricia Nixon Cox is secluded from reporters; she's waiting in a limousine, waiting for that trip back to San Clemente. And that is what's different for this arrival of Richard Nixon.

[Terry Drinkwater, reporting from Los Angeles Internation Airport:] .... There are microphones available here but we were told earlier that Mr. Nixon would not have any public comment to make at this time, and probably would not comment for some time, concerning his trip to China. A brief wave towards newsmen and towards the families of some of the Secret Service agents, who were the only other people admitted into the press area, a couple of them applauding as Mr. Nixon gets into his limousine with his wife and daughter and drives off.
