Colson, who says he has committed his life to Christ after he was convicted of obstructing justice, was picked to address the annual "commonwealth breakfast" by the Virginia Fellowship, the statewide religious group that sponsors the affair.

"This is a new Mr. Colson," said Samuel W. Jackson, cochairman of the breakfast. "He has something to say and we think people would like to hear it."
