## Suspended

## For 2 Years

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 27
(UPI) — The California
Supreme Court today
suspended attorney Donald H.,
Segretti from the practice of
law for two years because of
his "dirty tricks" role during
President Nixon's 1972 reelection campaign.
Segretti, 34, pleaded guilty

President Nixon's 1972 reelection campaign.

Segretti, 34, pleaded guilty
in 1973 to federal charges of
conspiracy and illegal
distribution of political
literature, and served a
sentence in prison.

He was accused of
distributing letters allegedly
written by the "Citizens for
Muskie Committee" falsely
accusing Sen. Hubert H.
Humphrey (D-Minn.) and Sen.
Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.)
of sexual improprieties.

The court said Segretti
"repeatedly committed acts
of deceit designed to subvert
the free electoral process."

The court ordered Segretti
suspended from practicing
law for five years, but stayed
execution of the order and
placed him on probation for
that period under conditions
which included actual
suspension for two years.
