2d Judge Bars Guilty Plea
On Gift to Nixon Campaign

—The second Federal court
judge has refused to allow industrialist Armand Hammer to
plead guilty to making an illegal \$54,000 contribution to
Richard M. Nixon's 1972 Presidential campaign.
United States District Court
Judge Lawrence Lydick said he
was concerned that Mr. Hammer's emotional state might
play too great a role in putting
pressure on him to plead guilty.
A Federal Court judge in
Washington earlier made a
similar ruling. The case then
was transfered to Los Angeles
because of Mr. Hammer's
health.
The 77-year-old head of Occidental Petroleum Corporation
has been hospitalized since Jan.
20 for a heart condition.
