

Nixon's Report on China Is Reported Given to Ford

President Ford and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger have received a written report from former President Richard M. Nixon about his recent trip to China, Time magazine reports in its current issue, out today.

Mr. Nixon indicated in his report that Chairman Mao Tse-tung had invited him as a demonstration of China's desire that the United States remain active in Asia as a counterweight to Russia, Time said. It characterized the Nixon report as "hardly sensational" in light of the fact that the former President spent about 10 hours with acting Prime Minister Hua Kuo-feng and an hour and 40 minutes with the chairman.

The magazine said that Mr. Nixon said Mr. Hua was "an impressive figure with a positive outlook toward U.S.-Chinese relations," and that Mr. Kissinger termed the Nixon report "generally helpful."
