Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger said that published accounts of his meeting with President Nixon the night before Nixon's res-ignation are distorted and inaccurate and "show an indecent lack of compassion."

Published excerpts from a new book, "The Final Days," depict a distraught Nixon, pounding the carpet in the White House and asking Kissinger between sobs, "What have I done? What has happened?"

State Department spokesman Robert Funseth con-firmed that Kissinger met with the book's authors, Washington Post reporters

Bob Woodward and Carl Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein, but Funseth re-fused to say whether Kis-singer was the source for the description of the late night encounter with Nixon. Funseth said Kissinger au-thorized him to make the following statement:

"Excerpts the secretary has seen of the material from the book of which he has personal knowledge contain too much gossip, too many inaccuracies, distor-tions and misrepresen'a-tions to be dealt with.

"In addition, the secretary believes these excerpts show an indecent lack of compas-sion and lack of essential human understanding on the part of the authors."
