"She's all right," said **Prince Philip**, referring to his injured daughter, Britain's **Princess Anne**, now recuperating in a London Hospital.

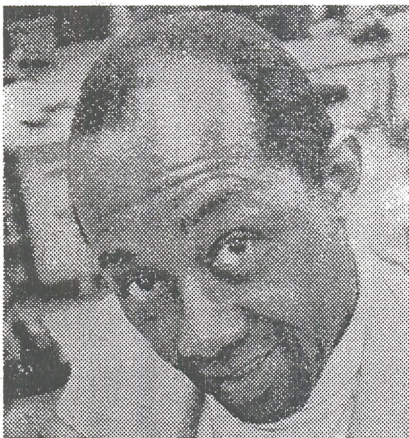

Franklin Delano Roosevelt Jr. has been divorced by his wife, **Felicia** (nee Warburg). The 61-year-old son of the late President was not present when the decree was issued by a New York state supreme court, not far from his
