

U.S. AIDES DENY PLAN FOR FULL PEKING TIES

WASHINGTON, May 28 (AP) —State Department officials are denying suggestions by a ranking member of the House of Representatives that the Ford Administration has secretly decided to establish full diplomatic relations with China after the November elections.

While reaffirming the United States commitment to move toward normal relations with Peking, an official said "there is no timetable" for completing the process.

Representative Clement J. Zablocki, Democrat of Wisconsin, told a House subcommittee on international relations yesterday that he was "quite fearful there is a movement afoot" to terminate relations with Taiwan early next year and establish formal diplomatic relations with Peking.

Mr. Zablocki, who is in line to become committee chairman next year, said he learned of the purported move from Taiwanese diplomats. He said that the policy probably would be carried out regardless of who wins the November elections because it is being encouraged by the State Department.
