**'Pardon' Record**

## A GOP Warning

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 15 — Colorado brewer Joseph Coors, a staunch Reagan man, has sent his fellow delegates a plastic phonograph record of Sen. Walter F. Mondale's speech accepting the Democratic vice presidential nomination last month.

The record contains the portion of the speech where Mondale (D-Minn.) drew loud cheers for his attack on President Ford's pardon of former President Nixon.

"Please play the record," Coors says in a covering letter. "If Gerald Ford is nominated by our party in Kansas City, you'll be hearing this attack again and again . . ."

"Ask yourself if the average American voter will resist this kind of politics. Ask yourself if you want to spend the fall campaigning answering this emotional attack."
