

Keynoter Eased Up Some On His Watergate Remarks

At the request of President Ford's campaign manager, Senator Howard Baker deleted some references to Watergate in his keynote speech to the Republican National Convention last night.

Peter Kaye, chief spokesman for the Ford campaign, said Baker had showed the draft of his speech to Rogers Morton, Mr. Ford's campaign manager.
