

Nixon, Aides Named

In a \$22 Million Suit

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27 (AP)—Jack Anderson, a newspaper columnist, filed a \$22 million damage suit today in which he accused former President Nixon and 19 subordinates of conducting a five-year campaign to destroy Mr. Anderson's credibility and take away his First Amendment rights as a newsman.

Lawyers for Mr. Anderson said that the suit was the first of its kind.

The civil damage suit, filed in United States District Court, cited 17 separate allegations of harassment, investigation, or surveillance by the Central Intelligence Agency or by the White House investigative unit known as "the Plumbers."

At a news conference, Mr. Anderson said that any money he might obtain from the suit would go to help protect the First Amendment rights of other reporters.

Most of the allegations contained in the suit had been previously reported.
