New Job for Nixon Aide

Convicted Watergate conspirator Dwight L. Chapin has been hired as president and publisher of the magazine "Success Unlimited."

Chapin, 35, was convicted April 5, 1974, on two counts of lying to a federal grand jury in connection with "dirty tricks" carried out during former President Richard M. Nixon's 1972 re-election campaign. He served eight months in a Lompoc (Santa Barbara county) minimum security federal penitentiary.

W. Clement Stone, Chicago insurance magnate and contributor to Mr. Nixon's campaign, announced Chapin's appointment to head the Chicago-based magazine. Stone helped found it in 1954.

Stone's announcement said the magazine has a circulation of 180,000 and provides "self-help and motivational material and information designed to educate, uplift and improve the lives of its readers."
