

Watergate Figures Won't Face

2d Trial for Ellsberg Burglary

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (AP)—A Federal judge ruled today that Bernard A. Barker and Eugenio R. Martinez would not be retried for their White House-sponsored burglary in the office of a California psychiatrist.

Judge Gerhard A. Gesell, acting at the request of the special Watergate prosecutor, signed an order dismissing charges against the two men who have already served more than a year apiece for their role in another break-in, the one at Watergate.

Mr. Barker and Mr. Martinez, both from Miami's Cuban immigrant community, were convicted of burglarizing the office of Dr. Lewis J. Fielding in 1971 searching for the records of Daniel Ellsberg, the Pentagon Papers figure, who was a patient of the doctor.
