

## Watergate Burglary Victim Gets \$215,000 Settlement

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 (UPI)—A second victim of the 1972 Watergate burglars has been paid a settlement from the funds of two of former President Richard M. Nixon's campaign committees, a spokesman for trustees of the funds said today.

R. Spencer Oliver, executive director of the Democratic Association of State Chairmen, with an office in the Democratic National Committee headquarters in the Watergate complex, accepted \$215,000 last July as settlement of his suit against the Committee for the Re-election of the President, the spokesman said.

The trustees paid \$775,000 earlier to the Democratic committee to settle its separate suit against the Republican committee.

Mr. Oliver sued shortly after the arrest of the seven burglars for the June 17, 1972, break-in at Democratic headquarters. His suit said that his telephone had been tapped by the burglars, who were later convicted of wiretapping charges.

The trustees are considering other claims against the committee as well as the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President.
