## 'A second-rate burglary,' Times says of Post

NEW YORK (AP) — A editorial in the New York Times today accuses the rival Washington Post of "a second-rate burglary" in the acquisition and early publication of material from the new book by former White House chief of staff H.R. Haldeman.

"Nothing involving Watergate seems to go smoothly," the editorial began. "Now we have the Washington Post's second-rate burglary of H.R. Haldeman's memoir of a third-rate burglary on the eve of its publication by Times Books, a subsidiary of the New York Times."

Times Books, an affilate of the New York Times Co., which publishes the newspaper, had closely guarded the 352-page book, which was scheduled for release Feb. 27. So had the Times Syndication Sales Corp., another affiliate, which had sold an estimated \$1 million in rights to newspapers and magazines that intended to publish 10,000-word excerpts beginning today.
