EXPLAINS STAND ON DIES

Mrs. Rossevelt Cites Custom on

MASHINGTON, Dec. 23 (AP)— Mrs. Franklin D. Robsevelt intimated today that she was following custom by not inviting the Dies committee as a group to White House functions.

She told her press conference that she did not think members of spe-cial Congressional committees were invited as a unit, although group invitations sometimes were extended to members of standing commit-

ed to members of standing commit-tees.

Her remarks were prompted by a reporter's request that she com-ment on a recent complaint of Rep-resentative J. Parnell Thomas of New Jersey that Mrs. Roosevelt had not invited the Dies commit-tee although she had asked to luncheon the leaders' of the Ameri-can Youth Congress who had testican Youth Congress who had testified before the committee. Mr. Thomas is a member of the committee. The First Lady said that she did

not invite the witnesses as a group but as individuals whom she knew. She wanted to make it clear, she added, that she asked a great many persons who have no official posi-tion because they happen to be friends or persons she knows.
