(f) Another leaflet (illustration on page 1) entitled "The Truth About the Origin of the War", furnishing a general survey of a White Book issued by the Reich, relative to the German-Polish crisis.

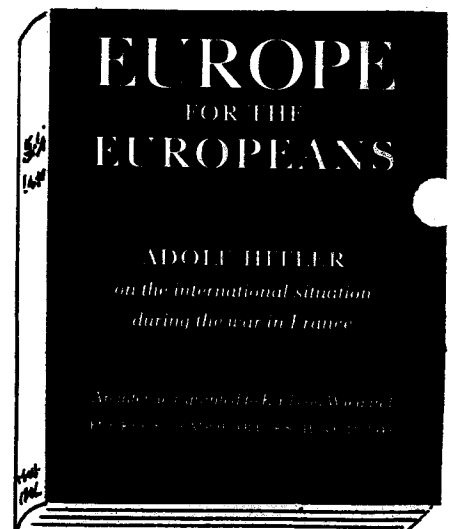
(g) A pamphlet of some 10,000 words (illustration on page 4), entitled "Ireland in the English Hell", and supposedly published by *Europa-Verlag* as one of a series of *Informations-Schriften* (Information Service). This essay, playing up to Irish insurgents, is an excerpt from Meyer-Erlachs' "Is God a Britisher?", a volume whose tendency is indicated by its title. The back of this pamphlet lists nineteen additional "information releases", and announces that the series "will be continued". Every single one of these pamphlets -- distributed by the Fichte

Bund! -- aims at subverting a specific sphere of English political or economic interests.

Fichte Bund has been active in the United States ever since Versailles. However, the current intensification of Goebbels-directed opinion-molding was not decreed until the Nazis realized that the nominees of both major parties promised to give all possible assistance to Great Britain. The Reich Propaganda Ministry was still more alarmed when the Aid-to-Britain sentiment was strongly seconded by such men as Dr. Robert A. Millikan of the California Institute of Technology, who averred: "American civilization can be defended in no other way than by victory of the Allies", and James W. Gerard, former United States Ambassador to Berlin, who declared: "There would be great danger to this country if Germany were victorious".

That individual expressions such as these were mere straws in the wind of public opinion, became evident to Berlin when Gallup Polls persistently indicated an overwhelming trend in the United States to come to the assistance of Great Britain. According to figures as of November 16th, fully 90 percent of all people expressed themselves "in favor of giving more help to England".

In the face of such unanimity, the Nazi propaganda general staff felt the necessity of putting

even more pressure behind its recently launched emergency campaign, taking its cue from such organizations as, for example, the "America First Committee". Accordingly, many Nazi cells and swastika sympathizers immediately aligned themselves with extreme isolationist groups of various descriptions. In support of this movement, Dr. Goebbels' publicistic Big Berthas thunder across the Atlantic, laying down a barrage of anti-British propaganda through channels long since cultivated by the Fichte Bund.

Propaganda Veteran

"inventor" of the "Absolute Ego". Fichte's *Reden an die deutsche Nation* (Addresses to the German People) comprised a farrago of super-patriotic anti-Napoleon pep talks which stirred subjugated Germany during 1807 and 1808.


Advertising itself as a "Union for World Veracity", Fichte Bund was organized in January, 1914, to establish an early foundation for a later refutation of Germany's guilt for World War I. By its very pan-Germanic nature, the organization managed to keep alive throughout the days of the German Republic, and, upon Hitler's emergence on the political horizon, took a new lease on life. It then expanded its professed activities to

serve the cause of peace and understanding by giving free information about the New Germany direct from the source; to protect human culture and civilization by disseminating facts about world Bolshevism, its authors and dangers.

From its very beginning, Fichte Bund, managed by Heinrich Kessemeier, Hamburg, as *Bundesführer*, made it a point to annotate all its innumerable leaflets and handbills (illustration on this page), "printed in 130 languages", with the request: "When writing letters to foreign countries, please enclose a Fichte Bund leaflet".

Herr Heinrich Kessemeier is the father of Theodore Kessemeier, manager of Fortra, Inc. This concern does a coast-to-coast land office business in the United States, shipping high-priced relief packages to Germany. Kessemeier père is now a man of 64; before becoming the publicistic inspiration of Fichte Bund, he made a literary reputation of sorts for himself as a writer on the occult. His son joined the Nazi movement at a very early date, enlisting as Stormtrooper.

As soon as Hitler came to power, Theodore was appointed manager of the Hamburg Gas Works. To assist his father in his propaganda venture, Theodore organized the Falken-Verlag which, for some time, furnished the "front" for Fichte Bund publications. Eventually, this camouflage imprint was dropped. Now, after having been dormant for many years, it has been resuscitated to re-enforce the Goebbels propaganda drive over here.

While he was active in Hamburg, Theodore Kessemeier eased himself into the good graces of the Hamburg-America Line. This German shipping concern did considerable "relief package" business during World War I. When historical parallels in 1939 created conditions similar to those prevailing during the Wilhelmian Era, Theodore Kessemeier -- residing in the United States at the time -- immediately set up a string of relief package agencies, dotting the entire United States with them (illustration on page 5). Thus, between the two Kessemeiers, provisioning of, and propagandizing for, the Third Reich is being carried on with great energy.

Fichte Bund always displayed what is known in the vernacular as "push". This attribute became especially evident after the inception

of the Hitler Era. Time was when Fichte Bund propaganda was not so much aimed against the British or the French as against Bolshevist Russia. From its files, NRS reproduces a letter (illustration on page 4), dated July 6, 1934. A specimen of hundreds of identical circulars, addressed to "American Newspapers Printed in the German Language" 5), this particular letter accompanied the German reprint of an originally French essay. Verbatim translated, it reads:

You are herewith receiving an essay entitled: "A Frenchman Relates His Experiences in the Soviet Paradise". This thesis is especially interesting in view of the Russian-French conspiracy against world peace. I would be very grateful to you if, after reprinting the essay, you would oblige me with three copies for our files. At the same time, I am sending you our latest leaflet No. 641, together with a short announcement relative to it. I would be very much obliged if you would reprint this short notice in your esteemed paper.

Goebbels at His Best

With typical Goebbels efficiency, every foreign-language department of Fichte Bund is in charge of a man who has lived for years in the very country which he is to cover with his propagandistic activities. Accordingly, the American section is directed by one Oscar C. Pfaus who, at one time, served in the regular United States army. He lived in Chicago for some years and, while domiciled there, organized the *Germanischer Bund*. This propaganda cell was simply the main Midwest distribution agency for Fichte Bund material. The *Germanischer Bund* never lagged in its efforts to plant such propaganda material (illustrations on page 6) as Axel Schmidt's "Against the Corridor", "The English Disarmament Plan as Viewed by Germany", "The Transformation of President Wilson's Idea of Disarmament", and "Armament Plans of Foreign Countries".

In the same way in which the Nazi regime seized upon the pre-Hitler Fichte Bund, it also pounced upon such pre-World War I institutions as annual "German Days" 6), held for many decades in all American cities of sufficient German population. This fact was bluntly

admitted in Julius Streicher's *Stürmer* 7) in January, 1936, in an article signed by Jakob Leimann 8), one-time leader of the German-Russian Alliance of Chicago. In this contribution, written in the usual Streicher-Goebbels style, Leimann went on record as follows:

In 1923, I emigrated to America and settled in Chicago, where I participated in German social life. For a few years I worked there as a reporter for the German-American-Russian Dakota Free Press, and in this paper described all my experiences in Russia.In 1930, I became founder for the Central Organization of Russo-Germans in America....I also came to know Mr. Oscar C. Pfaus, a loyal fighter for true Germanism in America....Mr. Pfaus was the founder of the Germanischer Bund....In 1933, after the National Socialist Revolution in Germany, I introduced a motion before the German Day Central Committee as follows: "That all un-German (i.e., non-Nazi!) elements should be excluded from the Committee". My motion was seconded by Mr. Pfaus of the Germanischer Bund, and by Fritz Gissibl 9) of the Friends of the New Germany....Thank God that our Führer has set up a strong National-Socialist regime in the Reich, and that he has men like Pfaus and Gissibl to work hard day and night....in the United States.

"WE'LL GO!"

While some of the German Days made an effort to resist Nazification, most of them were eventually overwhelmed by a swastika element, wrapping itself into the Stars and Stripes. Main reason for this spectacular advance of Hitlerism in the United States was the existence of such organizations as Pfaus' *Germanischer Bund*. With Goebbelesque thoroughness, Pfaus set up branch organizations in many American cities, including Los Angeles. There, the management of the *Germanischer Bund* was entrusted to Ernest Rheydt-Dittmer, working in close cooperation with William Dudley Pelley's 10) Silver Shirts. Documentary proof from NRS files (illustration on this page), self-explanatory as it is, bears out this fact.

Pfaus' propagandistic activities were as intensive as they were widely dispersed. He was inordinately eager to establish "points of support" on the West Coast, and to this end embarked upon a protracted correspondence with "sympathizers". Eventually,

he pulled a boner by addressing a Seattle, Wash., "fellow Nazi". From its file of letters covering this particular phase of Pfaus' activities, NRS here-with offers an exhibit (illustration on this page) which requires no further comment.

While Pfaus was thus spreading a net over the whole United States, he also kept in close contact with the Americagerman Bund and with his Man Friday, Theodore Kessemeier. The latter, during his sojourn in the United States, had entrenched himself with the Bund's weekly, *Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter* (1) and contributed to its columns with great industry. Among articles from Kessemeier's pen, regularly featured by *Weckruf*, is an especially "noteworthy" one, which appeared on March 28, last, and begins as follows:

Nothing Like Trying....

Time and again, America-Nazis have tried to extend their propaganda front in the United States beyond the ever-narrower confines of George Sylvester Viereck's (2) "German Library of Information" (3) and "Facts in Review" (4). Attempts have been made to establish a national publication in this country, but the outbreak of Hitler's War put an end to these plans. Now Goebbels' ambition to cover the United States more thoroughly has been revived by putting more force behind the Fichte Bund activities which aim at taking a hand in United States policies, domestic and foreign. These developments bear out News Letter reports (5) published as early as one year prior to the presidential campaign. Then, Nazi chieftains in the Reich, and their emissaries in the United States, made it perfectly clear that they were "making plans to take a hand in American politics". They indicated that their camp followers would flat-footedly come out for isolationism.

Now that these plans have failed, the Fichte Bund is thrown into the breach, and ever greater amounts of propaganda material enter this country via West Coast ports.
